- Migrate the platform onto a new design system one section at a time, owning the wireframes, mockups, and the production front-end (HTML, CSS, jQuery).
- Extend an inherited, incomplete style guide by designing the patterns it doesn't cover (tabbed layouts, two-column search, a card system for dense workflow tables) and keeping them consistent across sections so users don't relearn the interface page by page.
- Rebuild dense real-estate workflow screens (sales, listings, AML checks) so twenty years of business logic reads at a glance.
- Modernize legacy jQuery and enforce Content Security Policy compliance across the codebase.
